## **Featured Resolution**

TOPIC: IN SUPPORT OF INCORPORATING COMPREHENSIVE DEAF

CULTURE AND SENSISTIVITY EDUCATION INTO NURSING

**CURRICULA.**

WHEREAS, Deaf culture is rarely taught alongside race and geographical cultures as part of the diversi-

ty education for health care professionals, like nursing. This leads to healthcare systems providing

uninformed care (Richardson, 2014); and

WHEREAS, those in the Deaf community consider themselves part of a culturally-rich heritage, contra-

ry to the common healthcare provider belief that their inability to hear is a medical problem

(Fileccia, 2014); and

WHEREAS, with adequate American Sign Language medical interpreting services, the risk of obtaining inaccurate medical history assessment, medical errors, and noncompliance of Deaf patients' treat-

ment can be significantly decreased (Dickson, 2014); and

ment can be significantly decreased (Dickson, 2014), and

WHEREAS, in a study by Ebert and Heckerling (1995), writing was the most common method of com-

munication with Deaf patients (34% of encounters), however only 32% of participants believed it

was effective (Dickson, 2014); and

WHEREAS, Steinberg et al. (2006) conducted focus groups resulting in Deaf adults expressing fear of

the consequences in miscommunication with healthcare providers, such as nurses and physicians

(Dickson, 2014); and

WHEREAS, providing solely printed material about a Deaf patients' diagnosis may have negative im-

plications in obtaining informed consent; the published information may not be at an appropriate

reading level for the patient to comprehend (Dickson, 2014); therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Florida Nursing Students Association, and all chapters associated be in support of in-

tegrating Deaf culture as part of cultural diversity in nursing curricula, whether it be standard or

continuing education; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the included recommended guidelines of the nursing care of a Deaf person be printed

in Hotline at least once a year, if feasible; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the included recommended guidelines of the nursing care of a Deaf person be printed

in each chapter's newsletter at least once a year, if feasible; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Florida Nursing Students Association invite a Deaf nurse to speak further about Deaf

culture for the 2017-2018 Florida Nursing Students Association convention.; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Florida Nursing Students Association send a copy of this resolution to the Florida

Nurses' Association, the Florida League for Nursing, and any others deemed appropriate by the

Florida Nursing Students Association Board of Directors.
